As you will see on page 3, our region's Outstanding Alpine Patrol (**BM/BW**) and Patrol Representative (**Don Phipps**) were selected as **Division Outstanding Award winners**. CONGRATULATIONS! They automatically became National level award nominations. As this is written, I don't know the outcome of the National award selections but the mailing of this edition is being delayed so that you will know at the earliest possible date that two Division Awards were received by Ohio Region recipients during the fall division meeting.

Now on with the upcoming activities. New candidates are being trained or have been trained in some cases and most of the refreshers are set. We are surely in changing times and everywhere we turn, something else changes; hopefully for the good. Another change coming this winter is the adoption of an Ohio Region NSP Ski School. Dale Mihuta will be our leader and is planning to roll out the Division program based on plans developed during the June IT meetings.

Some areas have already started transitioning to PSIA certified NSP skiing trainers. Many patrollers may not notice the change. But for those involved in the skiing training program as instructors or students, I believe you will find it a better program. The NSP ski training program will be aligned with the recognized PSIA skiing development program and will incorporate field-tested PSIA ski instruction methods. By using PSIA methods, NSP didn't need to take the time and spend the development costs to start a new program. For toboggan training we will continue using the now familiar NSP toboggan training approach as presented in Toboggan Phase II.

As I get around to several refreshers this year I look forward to meeting you. If you would like to drop me a E-mail line or a phone call please feel free to do so. I'm looking forward to another exciting year in the Ohio Region. See ya on the snow!

DOWNHILL E-MAIL DISTRIBUTION

The Region Board and the Region Director have decided to try distributing *DOWNHILL* to patrollers, where possible, electronically via the Internet. Patrol Representatives have been asked to collect the e-mail addresses of patrollers this fall. Patrollers who will accept their *DOWNHILL* via the net will be notified by e-mail when an issue is available on the region web site for downloading. With a mouse click, the issue can be downloaded and then opened using Adobe Acrobat Reader, a program available at no cost by down loading from one of several web sites. Patrollers with no Internet access or not wanting to receive their *DOWNHILL* electronically will continue to receive their copy via the US Postal Service.

There are several reasons for transitioning to a combined internet-USPS distribution. Patrollers could have their information sooner, the day the issue is posted on the net vs. days to weeks of USPS bulk delivery delays. Issues posted on the net can be in color and there are other enhancing possibilities. But cost reduction is the major reason. Bulk USPS mailing fees average about \$165 per issue. If half the Region Patrollers were to receive their copies via the net, we could cut our mailing costs nearly in half or about \$280 each year plus some additional printing cost savings.

There is a downside to receiving your *DOWNHILL* via the Internet. You have to turn on your computer to read and refer to your newsletter. Paper copies are user friendly; you can mark them, pin the paper calendar on your bulletin board, tear out a return course registration coupon or use the pages to make paper airplanes. Of course, if you have a printer, you can print out the web site version, but that offloads the printing costs on to you. We have decided to proceed with Internet distribution primarily to cut Region costs and also to speed distribution. The Region Board believes that in the best interests of all to try Internet newsletter distribution while preserving the traditional option for those who do not have or don't want Internet access. You can let us know what you think of the idea by writing or emailing *DOWNHILL* or the region web site or by talking to your Patrol Representative. [

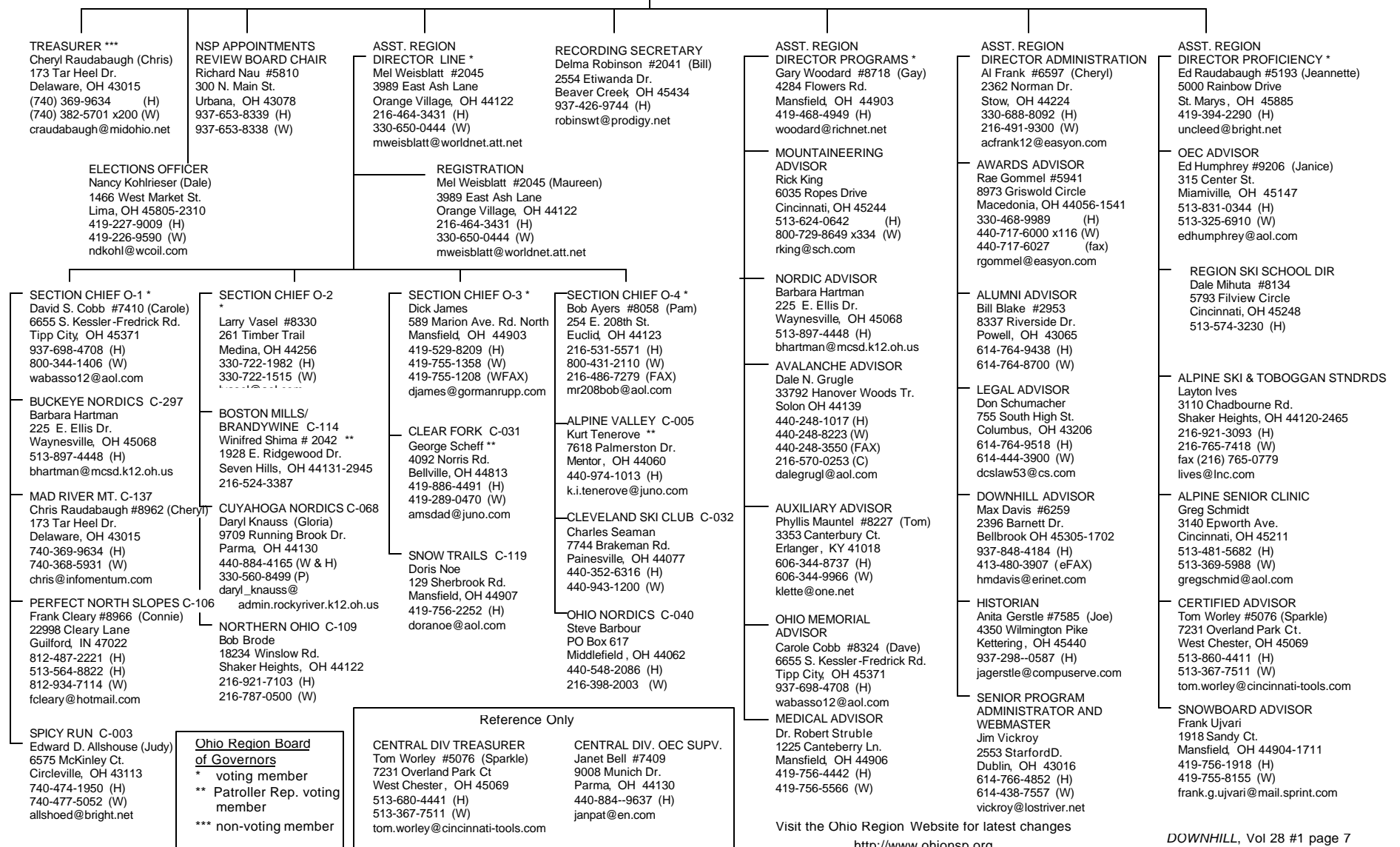
