

- 32.1 **QUALIFICATIONS:** Shall be a registered Patroller, preferably a Senior or National, able and willing to prepare and undertake a program to promote skiing safety in the Ohio Region.
- 32.2 **APPOINTMENT AND SUPERVISION:** Shall be appointed by and report to the Region Director through the Assistant Region Director for Proficiency.
- 32.3 **GENERAL DUTIES:** Shall meet the applicable planning, reporting, budgeting and records requirements listed under Ohio Region Officer's and Advisors General Duties (section 8).
- 32.4 **REGION SKI SAFETY TEAM:** Shall chair a team with three other similarly qualified Patrollers from Sections other than the Safety Advisor's home Section. The other members shall be selected by the respective Section Chiefs. This team shall help develop and execute the Region Ski Safety program.
- 32.5 **SAFETY POLICIES AND PROGRAMS:** Shall develop policies and programs to be available for use by Ohio Region Patrol Directors with their Patrols and their Area Managements to promote skier safety. It shall then be the responsibility of the individual Patrol Directors to adapt those policies and programs to meet the needs of the individual ski areas and to take appropriate action.
- 32.6 **SAFETY PROMOTION:** Shall assist in the promotion of consistent ski safety policies across all ski areas in the Ohio Region.
- 32.7 **SKI SAFETY LEGISLATION:** Shall assist in lobbying for ski safety legislation.
- 32.8 **POSITION DEACTIVATED:** The position of Region Safety Advisor was deactivated at the Ohio Region Spring 1993 Meeting; however, this section was retained to meet possible future requirements.
