



Leadership Commendation Award and National Appointment

National Appointments and Leadership Commendations: For patrollers who have demonstrated leadership, good character, diplomacy, positive attitudes, good judgment, exemplary patrolling abilities, and extraordinary service.



Congratulations to H Scott Griffith for his Leadership Commendation Appointment #8551 by the National Ski Patrol for extraordinary service over time as recognized by fellow national appointees.

Scott joined the National Ski Patrol as a candidate in 1993, becoming an alpine patroller in 1994. Scott fulfilled his duties as a patroller and as a leader in OEC Instruction, but truly became more engaged around 2010 when he increased his participation in fundraising, committee leadership, region involvement and interaction with local area management.

With his past history as an EMT and ongoing involvement in the OEC program, he began training for the senior program and became a senior patroller in 2014. This was followed by more active involvement in region training/evaluation for the senior module of the OEC program including hosting the region event in 2020.

Scott's determination and dedication to the NSP and his fellow patrollers was evidenced when he returned to patrolling in less than four months after a heart transplant in 2015. His motivation led to further involvement and assignment as Assistant Patrol Director later that year; then his selection to take over the Patrol Director role in 2017 and served until 2021. Over his time as Assistant and Patrol Director Scott has taken a very active role in the region and participated in division events every year to ensure that he stays current with NSP information and direction. Last year he was an active part of the committee to host the division event in the Ohio region, and has also hosted region banquets, meetings, testing and other events for the region each year.

Scott evidenced clear leadership through his engagement with other patrol directors in the region to establish better communications and exchange of ideas to work as a team.

Congratulations to Leah H. Morgan for her Appointment #128953 by the National Ski Patrol for extraordinary service over time as recognized by fellow national appointees.

This award nomination is typical for National Appointment submissions in that the award is long overdue for this individual. Every patrol has one or more people that have touched every patroller in a meaningful way and she is that patroller. Beginning with the fact that if one looks at the credits in the current edition of the Emergency Transportation Manual, you will find her name as a contributor to that publication. She has helped every patroller on

our patrol become a better skier and toboggan handler through the countless hours she has spent teaching and mentoring both students and instructors. In my 21 years as a patroller, I can say for almost all those years, she has single handedly completed toboggan refreshers for well over half of the patrol each season. She is one of only a few patrollers in our area that wears both the helmet of an NSP member and also is very active as a supervisor and Level 2 PSIA instructor in the local Snow Sports school. She has been on the board of that organization and also our local patrol at Paoli Peaks,

Leah has served as a Toboggan Instructor (since 1993), OEC Instructor, Ski Instructor (1997) (Level II), Instructional Development Instructor, Toboggan IT (2010-2018), Assistant Toboggan Coordinator for Southern Region, and Ohio Region Editor of The Downhill from 2012-present. She served as assistant Patrol Director from 1993 to 1996 and Patrol Representative for the 1999-2002 seasons as well as local area Board member for multiple years. Leah has participated in local and regional trainings for many years and been a part of senior training and evaluations, both as a participant and as an instructor in the Southern Region and Ohio Region. She was awarded the "Southern Cross" four different seasons from the Southern Region in Training, Administration, and Patrol Director. She has trained at the Boyne Division Level on four separate occasions in skiing and toboggan and one toboggan at A-Basin on a National Level.

She was a High school ski club sponsor 1997 to 2019 helping with Special Olympics and 6th grade skiing field trips. In local patrol service, she achieved over 100 service hours every year for 20+ years to be a member of our local Century Club.

Another example of the dedication of this patroller is a story of drive and determination. About seven years ago she was seriously injured in a horrific automobile accident. She had significant trauma to her lower extremities and for a time it was unsure if she would walk normally again. She immediately began an exhaustive physical therapy regimen and was once again skiing and teaching the very next season, never missing a beat with her service to the NSP and the local snow sports school.

Finally, as a "Lifetime Member" of the National Ski Patrol, she is always one of the patrollers that will raise their hand when help is needed. Last season we had to quickly change our toboggan protocols due to the Vail acquisition and she was instrumental in bringing her OET experience to that work group. Whether it is recruiting, OEC, OET, ID or anything patrol-related, she is always there offering her help and years of experience.

National Appointment and Leadership Commendation Appointment

"Receiving a National Appointment or a Leadership Commendation Appointment is not something for which a patroller-volunteer or paid-can work or plan. A patroller does not apply for a National Appointment or Leadership Commendation Appointment or undergo a skills and knowledge evaluation. To obtain this classification, a patroller must be nominated by other patrollers who hold the same appointment for demonstrating exemplary service to the NSP. A patroller with a National Appointment or Leadership Commendation Appointment is an individual who has demonstrated leadership, good character, diplomacy, a positive attitude, good judgment, unusual qualities of patrolling ability, a genuine desire to serve the skiing public, and extraordinary service to the National Ski Patrol.
