On November 11, we will hold the Second Annual Senior OEC/ARM Candidate Calibration event at the Dublin Library in Central Ohio. Thanks go to Senior Test Coordinator Whit Eakin, Senior Program Advisor Chris Miller, and ARD of Programs Tricia Mencin, who have led the way to organize this event and mentor our new staff as well. With a large pool of candidates, and a new model for the test events, this session will be crucial in developing new Senior Patrollers and Senior Alpine Patrollers.

Finally, mark your calendars for December 2nd and 3rd at Mad River Mountain. Believe it or not, we are doing the Senior testing for OEC and ARM before we get busy on the snow. Thanks to a long overdue decision by the National Board of NSP to remove the "on-snow" requirement for these modules, we can move the test back to when we used to do it – and keep the snow season for fun on the snow! This event always welcomes volunteers – so let us know if you can come and we will find a way for you to help.

# Hello!

My name is Tricia Mencin and I am the new ARD for Programs for the Ohio Region. This is my 32nd year on ski patrol at Boston Mills/Brandywine/Alpine Valley. I am looking forward to working with all of you as you join us in the many programs the Ohio Region has to offer.

If you are looking to advance your patroller status, reach out to Chris Miller about the Senior Program or Jim Seeger about the Certified Program. I know they would both love to share details of those programs and the support they can provide to you along the journey to your new patroller classification or in your quest to enhance your skills. The Senior program is busy preparing candidates for the Senior OEC evaluation scheduled for December 2nd and 3rd. This early December evaluation should help those pursuing Senior to focus in season on Ski and Toboggan training. The Certified program is planning on a recertification/precertification at PNS January 6/7, 2024. In addition, the Certified staff is putting together some educational modules for everyone who is interested in learning about this national education program. Watch for more details this winter.

For those looking to learn a bit more about safety as it relates to our outdoor environment, watch for information from Jay Zedak about upcoming Avalanche Awareness courses and from Tim Durbin about Mountain Travel and Rescue sessions. There have been many discussions around the requirements for Avalanche courses and trainers across the NSP and we appreciate Jay's dedication to this realm, staying on top of the changes and ensuring we can continue to offer courses in our Region.

There will be a Level 1- Mod 1 Avalanche course Jan 6<sup>th</sup> at PNS and Feb 10<sup>th</sup> at BMBWAV. Jay noted we expect the snow storms to become heavier with more moisture in the snow. This will make for heavier loads of snow, higher than previous years, with the possibility of larger and more destructive force avalanches occurring earlier in the seasons. This is a great reminder to stay aware and learn more in an Avalanche awareness course.

Tim has scheduled an MTR course for November 11-12th at PNS for those interested in learning more about advanced rescue techniques and backcountry safety.

Our Women's Program Advisor, Kristin Anderson, continues to support and encourage the women patrollers in the Region. Look for details and plan on attending the Central Division Women's event at Nubs Nob the weekend of January 26-28th.

Mason Boswell recently joined as our Region YAP Advisor and has lots of experience and enthusiasm for the YAP program. As we look to the future of our organization, let's remember the great benefits of the Young Adult Program. Reach out and learn more about enhancing (or starting) a YAP program at your resort.
